#### LICENCE CONDITIONS SCHEDULE

#### Prescribed licence conditions

Imposed pursuant to Section 6(a) of the Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Act 1985

#### 1 Insurance required

Before the ground is used for motor vehicle racing or practice, the licensee is to provide the Chief Executive [Office of Sport] with evidence satisfactory to the Chief Executive that public risk insurance cover has been effected in respect of all claims arising out of each meeting at the ground. The State of New South Wales (represented by the Minister [of Sport]) must be noted on the insurance policy as an insured or interested party for its respective rights and interests.

#### 2 Insurance to be maintained

The licensee must maintain the insurance cover during the currency of the licence and notify the Chief Executive [Office of Sport] immediately on receipt of any advice from the insurer of intention to cancel the policy.

## 3 Notice of meeting to police and ambulance service

The licensee must, at least 14 days before the holding of a race meeting at the ground, give notice in writing of the intended meeting to each of the following:

- (a) the officer-in-charge of the police station nearest to the ground,
- (b) the officer-in-charge of the ambulance station nearest to the ground.

#### 4 Fire-fighting appliances

The licensee must provide and maintain serviceable fire-fighting appliances as required by the Minister for the type of motor vehicle racing conducted at the ground.

#### 5 Maintenance of safety fences

The licensee must maintain all fences and other safety devices constructed at the ground in such condition as is necessary to ensure that they provide the protection they are designed to provide.

#### 6 Directions for additional safety measures

The licensee must comply with any written direction of the Minister served on the licensee requiring the construction of a fence or any other safety device at the ground to such specifications as are stated in the direction.

#### 7 Location of pit area or paddock area

The licensee must comply with any written direction of the Minister served on the licensee requiring that the location of a pit area or paddock area be changed.

### 8 Plan of ground to be displayed

The licensee must keep the licence for the ground displayed in a position accessible to all patrons together with a copy of the plans of the ground showing the location of the various facilities at the ground, including any pit and paddock areas and any unauthorised areas.

#### 9 Toilet facilities

The licensee must provide and maintain sanitary accommodation for both sexes in such quantity and at such a standard as are satisfactory to the local council.

# 10 Inspection of ground

The licensee must ensure that access is available to all parts of the ground:

- (a) to any police officer on duty, and
- (b) to any person authorised to inspect the ground by the Minister, who desires to carry out an inspection for the purpose of ascertaining whether the Act, the regulations and the conditions of the licence are being complied with.

### 11 Reporting of serious accidents

If, during a race meeting at the ground, a person dies or is injured in a way that requires medical attention, the licensee must give an accident report (in a form approved by the Chief Executive [Office of Sport]) to the Chief Executive and the officer-in-charge of the nearest police station as soon as is reasonably practicable.

## 12 Notification of change in ownership of ground

The licensee of a ground must notify the Chief Executive [Office of Sport] immediately of any change in the person or persons who have the right to immediate possession of the land on which the ground is situated.

## 13 Notification of alterations to configuration of track

The licensee must obtain the prior approval of the Chief Executive [Officer of Sport] for any alteration to the configuration of the racing track at the ground.

# Other licence conditions

Imposed pursuant to section 6(b) of the Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Act 1985

The licensee must, at least 14 days before the holding of a race meeting at the ground, give notification in writing of the intended meeting to the Chief Executive, Office of Sport using the Office of Sport Motor Vehicle Race Meeting Notification form. The licensee must provide evidence of holding the public risk insurance cover specified in Condition No. 1 with the notification. The licensee must submit to the Chief Executive, Office of Sport a completed Office of 15 Sport Certificate of Compliance for each motor vehicle race meeting held at the ground. The Certificate of Compliance must be received at the Office of Sport no later than 7 days after the last day of the meeting. 16 The licensee must ensure that there is an Emergency Management Plan for the ground and that each user of the ground integrates its activities into this plan. 17 The licensee must ensure that each user of the ground is adequately covered by insurance. 18 The licensee must ensure that provision is made at the ground for a dedicated area for parking and marshalling of emergency vehicles, and that any such area is sign posted The licensee must ensure the provision of ready access to and from each track area at 19 the ground for emergency vehicles and personnel. A qualified first aid officer as a minimum must be on duty at all times while the ground is 20 in use. 21 The licensee must ensure all access points to each track and pit area at the ground are secured at all times by a keyed or padlocked gate, a padlocked chain, or physically manned by authorised persons while the ground is in use. 22 Signs must be located at the ground indicating all restricted areas. 23 The licensee must ensure spectators are prohibited from entering those areas of the ground to which they are not authorised by the provision of safety fencing, spectator control fencing and marshals and signage indicating the unauthorised areas.

The licensee must comply with any lawful request given by a member of the NSW Police Force. The licensee must provide sufficient licensed security officers at the ground following 25 consultation with the NSW Police Force. The licensee must ensure that all relevant employees, volunteers, race officials and 26 competitors are aware of, and comply with, the requirements of the *Motor Vehicle* Sports (Public Safety) Act 1985, the Motor Vehicle Sports (Public Safety) Regulation 2015 and the conditions imposed on the licence. 27 The licensee must comply with the development consent granted by the local council for the ground and any conditions imposed on that consent. 28 The licensee must ensure that persons undertaking duties at the ground, including race officials and stewards, hold accreditation appropriate to the role and the level at which they are expected to work. 29 The licensee must ensure that competitors involved in motor vehicle race meetings held at the ground have completed the relevant tests, assessments and training courses, and hold the appropriate licences or certificates, for involvement in the activity. 30 All notifications, submissions, information and other documents required to be provided or submitted to the Office of Sport must be made via email to motorsport@sport.nsw.gov.au or by post addressed to the Office of Sport, Regulation Unit, Locked Bag 1422, Silverwater, NSW, 2128. Motor vehicle race meetings held under a permit issued by Karting (New South Wales) 31 Incorporated and must be conducted in accordance with the conditions, rules and regulations of Karting (New South Wales) Incorporated.
